Paths in the centre of the kibbutz: The paths restoration project was planned to be funded, for the most part, by the regional council. Unfortunately, when we came to plan the budget and start work, at the end of March, it turned out that all the development budgets in the regional council were frozen, until the incumbent head of the council examines and decides which project is worthy and which is not. In the absence of financing, the implementation of the project is also frozen. We hope that the process of approving the projects in the regional council will progress quickly and that the restoration of the paths will be found to be a project worthy of funding by the council.

Removing dishes from the kitchen: On April 1st, a humourous post was published by the food branch levying a fine for removing utensils from the dining room. Although the issue of the fine was an April Fool's joke, the issue of removing the utensils is not a laughing matter at all.

The utensils of the food branch are intended for use in the dining room and not for take-aways. Unfortunately, we are experiencing a very large shortage of dishes because of the use that is not in the dining room. Dishes are taken home and not returned and even thrown in the trash!

The immediate implication of removing dishes from the dining room is a shortage of utensils and the unnecessary cost of thousands of shekels per year in replacements. Kindly bring containers from home!

Guards at the gate: The presence of the guards at the gate seems to many people to be ineffective. We are aware of the limitations of guarding activities at the gate. The limitations stem mainly from the structure of the gate area and the gates themselves which allow free passage once they have been opened. The expectation that the guards will check everyone who enters is not reasonable considering the volume of traffic and with the gates as they function today. However, the guards see who enters. Some of the people are already known to them or have presented an entry permit and they check drivers randomly and report to Yarden if a suspicious vehicle enters. The ineffective guard who was on the noon-evening shift, was replaced by a better guard.

The need to continue guarding the gate, as it is today with all the limitations, will soon be examined by a security committee. If we find that it is unnecessary, it will be ceased.

We are constantly looking at solutions to make security and access control more effective and cost effective.

**Operating a charging station for an electric vehicle:** Finally, the charging station in the main parking lot for electric vehicles is up and working.

The station is operated by the Nofer Energy company and provides a "normal" charging speed. It is not a fast charger.

The service is intended for those authorized by the kibbutz only.

To get permission to use the station, you must contact Esther Ben Bassat.

The cost will be charged to the personal budget of the user. The cost per kw/h is the cost + 40 agorot plus VAT.

From now on, we will no longer allow the installation of private car charging stations. This is for safety reasons and to regulate electricity consumption on the kibbutz. The stations already installed will be phased out.

The operation of the car charging station in the main parking lot is the pilot in route to extensive deployment of charging stations throughout the kibbutz, in accordance with the developing need. That's it for now.

# Refreshing your Memory re the Guidelines for Using the Kibbutz's Kalnoiyot (Scooters). Talia Arad

I would like to reiterate the instructions regarding driving a Kalnoit (hence forth, scooter). (as defined in the procedure which can be found in Kehilanet – Ed)

As long as the scooter belongs to the kibbutz, it may not be driven by a person who has not received instruction and permission from the garage and signed the agreement.

The scooters are not insured (not required by law) and we cannot cover the costs if there is damage to the scooter itself or other property that is damaged as a result of driving by an unauthorised person. (such as damage to a parked vehicle, a barrier, etc.). In such cases, the member registered as using the scooter will bear the costs of the repair.

The scooter will be used only for the purpose of mobility of the person and his helper (caregiver or accompanying family member in the service of the disabled member).

When the scooter is private, meaning that it was purchased privately, these rules do not apply.

Remember to bring the scooter on time for its regular service at the garage, when invited. This regular maintenance is very important for the safety of the user.

### The Music School - An Interview with Avner Alterlevi

A national convention of conservatory orchestras

**Dorit:** Hi, Avner. I was asked to write a few words about the orchestra convention held last Thursday. I didn't go. You traveled with the symphony orchestra of the Music School. So let me interview you. First - explain to me what this conference is all about?

Avner: This is a once-a-year convention of student symphony orchestras.

**Dorit:** What is a symphony orchestra?

**Avner:** an orchestra that has representation of all sectors of musical instruments, for example string instruments, wind instruments, etc.

Dorit: So, what is philharmonic?

**Avner:** same A philharmonic is a national orchestra and there is one in the country.

Dorit: Under whose auspices did it take place? The Ministry of Education?

**Avner:** Yes. It should be understood that not every conservatory has a symphony orchestra. We have one, under the management and direction of Stas. And that definitely puts us in the front row of conservatories in Israel.

**Avner:** From classical to Israeli. A diverse programme, as only Stas knows how...


A piece by a composer - Fanny Mendelssohn, a piece by an English composer, a piece by Naomi Shemer, and a string of children's songs. As I said - a variety...

Subject: C

All the C's in "Pacific Ocean" are pronounced differently.

#### **STRENGTHS**

has only nine letters, but all except one of them are consonants! This earns the word a Guinness World Record. It is also one of the longest monosyllabic words of the English language.

#### **EUOUAE**

Euouae is six letters long, but all the letters are vowels. It holds two Guinness World Records. It is the longest English word, composed exclusively of vowels, and it has the most consecutive vowels of any word. (It is a musical term from medieval times.)

#### UNIMAGINATIVELY

.... has lots of vowels – eight in total: what is neat about this word is that its vowels and consonants alternate. It is not the longest word with alternating consonants and vowels, though...

THE HISTORY OF THE "MIDDLE FINGER"

Before the Battle of Agincourt in 1415, the French, anticipating victory over the English, proposed to cut off the middle finger of all captured English soldiers. Without the middle finger, it would be impossible to draw the renowned English longbow and therefore they would be incapable of fighting in the future.

This famous English longbow was made of the native English yew tree, and the act of drawing the longbow was known as "plucking the yew" (or 'pluck yew').

Much to the bewilderment of the French, the English won a major upset and began mocking the French by waving their middle fingers at the defeated French, saying, "See, we can still pluck yew!" The difficult consonant cluster at the beginning has gradually changed to a labiodental fricative, and thus the words are often used in conjunction with the one-finger salute!

## Some Clarifications and Emphases Regarding Rostered Shifts Zohar Asaf

This week I published a schedule of shifts for the months of May-June.

As a result, some problems and questions arose from the members, so I would like to answer:

- 1. The frequency in the months April-June are much higher because of the holiday season, because in addition to the regular weekends there are 4 more "Fridays" and 4 "Saturdays" where there are more people on duty than on a normal weekend. Apart from that, the issue of frequency is checked once a month by Kinneret and the situation is completely under control.
- 2. I made several beginner's mistakes and there are a few individual members who got two shifts close together. This is also due to the holiday placements you chose, and the special kitchen placements that some of you requested. I'm sorry if it came out that way. I believe that in the next placements there will be no such mistakes.
- 3. There is one holiday eve shift a year. But the festival evenings are conducted like a normal Shabbat.
- 4. If you plan vacations or absences, you must notify me in advance to avoid a situation where you receive shifts while you are not here.
- 5. Exchanges are made between members themselves, without my intervention.
- 6. Several people contacted me about the kitchen the issue is being handled and will be resolved soon.
- 7. There are two servers missing for Seder Night. I would appreciate volunteers. Those who agree to volunteer and have already done a holiday eve, it will count as a holiday eve for the next year.

Thank you for your cooperation and thank you for doing your duties.

I fully believe that it is an honour to do duty work.
