May the year 5786 be a year of blessing, peace and tranquillity for every home in Israel.


















#### To the Veterans of Kibbutz Yizrael





# **Community Management Summary – 14.09.2025**

**Participants:** Erez Peleg, Talia Arad, Yifat Segal, Yishai Levi, Kinneret Govrin, Maor Persai, Noga Harpaz, Naomi Amit, Shlomo Levi, Limor Griman

#### 1. Economic Update

Maor Persai, CFO, presented the kibbutz's financial situation using the "Assets and Liabilities" model.

- Assets: physical property, income-generating property, cash, deposits, receivables, etc.
- Liabilities: debts to banks, suppliers, obligations to funds, and members' personal budgets.

The kibbutz's total assets far exceed its liabilities.

A current (annual) managerial balance sheet was also presented, showing assets and liabilities available within one year. This indicates a positive gap, serving as a "safety cushion."

A significant drop in income from business profits in 2025 requires use of this safety cushion to fund ongoing kibbutz life (community needs, completion of the Rugby neighbourhood, reserve fund deposits, etc.).

- The cushion allows us to complete 2025, but a shortfall may arise in 2026, requiring deep reflection on how to finance kibbutz life.
- Current model cannot fully fund kibbutz life; budgetary changes are needed.
- Further cuts are difficult after years of streamlining.
- All available resources should be pooled and budgeted by needs, not old categories.
- Questions were raised about the fairness of distributing member bonuses not from profits but from the cushion. Request made to review the profit-sharing formula with public support for 2025.
- Transparency and ongoing updates to members are essential.

**Conclusion:** Prepare a tighter 2026 budget plan, define must-do tasks, and present gaps and implications to the Executive Committee, Economic Council, and members.

## 2. Change of Purpose: Temporary Apartments in Parents' Housing

Guest: Nitzan Kamilian (Housing Committee Coordinator)

• In 2022, two housing units were built in Parents' Housing as temporary homes to speed up absorption.

- Currently: two families live there, one moving to permanent housing by year-end, freeing one unit.
- Today: 14 families/individuals await permanent housing, plus 5 more families not yet eligible.
- Fewer permanent housing units are available, while temporary housing has increased.
- Housing Committee recommends designating the two units for permanent use.
- This will not harm future absorption, as 2026 candidates will move into other vacated homes.
- Request: Housing Committee be authorised to decide case-by-case if a unit is temporary or permanent, for flexibility.

**Decision:** Community Management authorises Housing Committee to determine the status (temporary/permanent) of the two new units in Parents' Housing, separately for each.

#### 3. Proposal: Candidate Vetting Team before Membership Votes

Guests: Eviatar Assaf (Absorption Committee Chair), Stas Gavrilov, Irit Shemesh (Members Committee Reps)

- The "Members Committee" (Vaadat Chaverim) is responsible for supporting candidates before membership votes.
- With few candidates yearly, this was manageable. Now, with demographic growth, more support is needed.
- **Proposal:** create a dedicated team of 4 members, operating as an extension of the Members Committee, focused solely on candidate vetting. Members to be recommended by the Appointments Committee and approved by the General Assembly.

#### **Discussion:**

- Question whether this task should belong to Members Committee at all (historical decision, never fully justified).
- Counterpoint: their involvement builds ties with new families even after formal absorption.
- Goal: gather multiple perspectives on candidates before the vote.

**Decision:** Further discussion needed; role definitions for Members Committee must be clarified. Decision to be finalised by end of 2025, so that by summer 2026 membership votes, the new team format will be in place.

#### 4. Farewell & Holiday Toast

**Ilana Peleg** and **Stas Gavrilov** have completed three years of service on the Community Management team. They contributed with great dedication, responsibility, bringing valuable perspectives and constructive challenges.

Gratitude was expressed for their service.

A toast was raised for a good New Year for Israel and Kibbutz Yizrael.

# **Economic council meeting summary - 15.09.25**

Chairperson: Uri Gilad Secretary: Eddie Solow

Participants: 26 council members

#### **Agenda**

#### 1. Mid-2025 summary – Maytronics

Dubi Ofer, Chair of the Board, opened with observations from his first few months in office:

- Maytronics faces strong competitors flooding markets with cheaper (less reliable but adequate) robots, causing a decline in sales.
- The company produces the strongest and most reliable brand in the industry.

- Distribution is broad and effective (via distributors and direct internet sales), but online marketing is under-leveraged and must grow.
- Maytronics is on the verge of launching a new product line, *Dolphin X*, highly anticipated in the pool market. This is expected to improve market position.
- The company carries heavy debt, requiring balance sheet improvement.

He also discussed the search for a new CEO following Sharon's resignation. A board search committee (including Idan Zelas and Arik Shor) was formed with Israel's leading executive search firm. The goal: appoint a CEO by end of November, with entry into the role a few months later. He thanked CEO **Sharon Goldenberg**, who committed to remain until his successor assumes office and to ease him into the job.

#### **Sharon Goldenberg** presented the half-year summary:

- His resignation stemmed from managerial responsibility and confidence in the company's path.
- Q2 results were "disappointing": below both budget and forecast, mainly due to execution challenges rather than macroeconomics alone.

#### **Key figures:**

- **Revenue:** №515m, a 15% drop (vs. №607m in Q2 2024). About №50m in orders were not delivered due to logistics, raw-material shortages, etc., with some lost.
- **Gross margin:** ~35%, down sharply, due to reduced production while selling off inventory.

#### Positive notes:

- Stronger than budgeted performance results in Australia (robots + chemicals).
- Israel market exceeded budget despite security situation.
- **Inventory reduced** by nearly №200m compared to Q2 2024 faster than planned enabling debt repayment and lower interest costs.
- Development underway on three major 2026 product launches: *Dolphin X, S-Line upgrade*, and a new skimmer.
- Organisational restructure reduced the number of Vice-Presidents from 9 to 5, enabling faster decision-making.

**Risks:** Both Sharon and Dubi noted concern that rising global anti-Israeli sentiment could harm sales, though direct impact is not yet significant.

#### 2. Half Yearly summary - Held companies

Idan Zelas, CEO of Yizrael Holdings, reviewed portfolio companies:

- **Teldor**: Slight improvement over last year but still making a loss weak overseas sales (especially USA), heavy debt. Focus shifting to defense sector and niche products.
- **Kapro**: Results similar to last year, ~30% gross margin but below budget. Challenges: weaker sales in Russia/Ukraine and US-China tariffs. Financially stable, preparing new strategy under CEO Ariel Dolinko (Yizrael member).
- **Netzer Sensors**: Continued double-digit growth and high efficiency, very high gross margin (~60%), showing technological edge. Risks: competition from large firms and foreign government pressures, with no protective patents.
- Ma'agan Eden Resort Village: Better than forecast strong Q1 (evacuees still present), weaker Q2 due to renovations after the evacuees returned home), but summer season was very good by in large.
- Income-producing real estate: "Sens Energy Control" leased the southern IDL building for 5 years. Annual forecast from real estate: revenue №13.9m, cash flow after financing expenses №10m.

#### 3. Mid-2025 summary and forecast – Holdings

Idan presented the consolidated half-year report:

- No dividend from Maytronics in 2025, leaving a №15m gap vs. the financial plan.
- Main revenue forecasts:
  - o Real estate ~₪14m (before depreciation).
  - o Capital gains from investments: ~₪2m (Jan–Jul).
  - o Dividends + management fees from holdings: ~₪4m.
- Loans: Kibbutz debt at №103m (down from №127m in Dec 2024). Annual repayment ~№10m.
- Net cash flow forecast for 2025: negative №12.5m (operating, investing, and financing combined).

**Recommendation (Finance Committee + Executive Board):** reduce target for profit transfers from holdings to №21m (vs. №26.7m originally).

#### **Discussion points:**

- This is a prudent and responsible step, avoiding deeper financial strain.
- Question whether dividend potential from holdings was fully maximized.

- Criticism of past kibbutz investments that yield low returns compared to financial funds.
- Question whether asset sales were considered to meet transfer goals.
- Desire to improve profitability of held companies.
- Criticism expressed of kibbutz decision-making leading to current state.
- Request made for detailed reports on energy sector, solar systems, and gas station.
- If the final results are better than the forecast, a larger dividend will be paid.
- Resolution:

The community management must amend the 2025 budget in light of revised forecasts. Profit transfers from holdings capped at **□21m**, with **no budget overruns permitted**.

**Vote result:** 19 in favour, 2 against, 4 abstained.


# **Work During the Tishrei Holidays**



#### The transition season has arrived!

Although autumn officially begins on **22–23 September** with the first rains, the heat hasn't really subsided yet.

**TOU (Time of Use) Electricity Tariffs – Transition Season** 

Valid from October until winter rates in December

- Peak 17:00–22:00
- Intermediate none
- Off-peak all other hours (22:00 17:00)

# Reminder!

**Solar water heaters** work on solar energy until the end of September. After that, gradually, electricity will be used to supplement the sun's work.

• If you feel the sun isn't heating the water enough – you may switch on the boiler manually for **30 minutes only**. Don't forget to turn it off, or you'll discover at the end of the month (with your electricity bill) that you forgot.

#### **Looking Ahead to Winter**

- Now is the time to think about heating. perhaps buy a radiator on sale before prices go up when the cold truly arrives.
- Check that all external doors and windows close tightly.

#### Winter Clock 2025

- **Daylight Saving Time ends**: Sunday, **26 October 2025**, at 02:00 turn clocks back one hour to 01:00, and enjoy an extra hour's sleep.
- That marks the end of 219 days of "summer clock."
- Winter time ends: Friday, 27 March 2026.

If you use a **Shabbat timer for your boiler**, remember to adjust both the clock and the switching hours to match winter time and the new "off-peak" schedule.

# Patchi Turns Ninety: Between Manuscripts and the Poetry of Life

On Thursday, 18.9.25, about fifty guests gathered at the home of Yonatan Bassi on Kibbutz Ma'ale Gilboa, to celebrate the 90th birthday of Avraham (Patchi) Shapira. The initiative for the event was born from a note published in the kibbutz bulletin, which Yonatan received. He read it with emotion and declared: "We are celebrating your birthday, Patchi, a party at my kibbutz."

The chosen venue—Yonatan's house, overlooking the breathtaking landscapes of the valley beyond the Gilboa—proved to be an inspired choice. The view, the air, and the unique atmosphere gave the celebration both festive and profound dimensions.

As is the tradition, the gathering brought together close friends and men and women of letters, including Benny Ziffer, Professor Avi Sagi, literary figure Israel Carmel, the poet Rivka Miriam, along with Patchi's family and kibbutz friends. The celebration was accompanied by a rich table, warm greetings, and a deep sense of community.

Throughout the evening, participants rose one after another to praise the birthday celebrant, who was visibly moved. Among the tributes were exceptional moments when Patchi himself shared personal experiences from his many years in the company of the works of the great intellectuals and writers of the 19th and 20th centuries—including Franz Kafka and Gershom Scholem.

He told of the moving occasions when he had the privilege to touch and spend time with the manuscripts of these giants, and even to serve humbly as one entrusted with their safekeeping.
